KMF held its **biennial Board of Directors Retreat** in Charlotte, focusing on strategy, collaboration, and planning for 2025



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
March

April

The **5th Annual Night For Knox Gala** raised nearly \$400,000 for brain cancer research!

Our staff took some much needed R&R after a successful winter and spring full of fundraising!



June

We sent a **\$250,000 mid-year gift** to the Duke Brain Tumor Center, supporting the startup phase of KMF's **FIFTH glioblastoma research project** at Duke since 2021. The **MOAB Trial** is now open at Duke, Kansas City, Huntsman Cancer Center in Utah, and UCSF. So far, **35 patients are enrolled**, and KMF support is enabling deep analysis of their tumor samples.

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KMF's 5 Landmark Projects at the Duke Brain Tumor Center

Dear KMF Community,

As we come to the end of 2025, we want to share a heartfelt update from the Tumor Immunobiology Lab (TIL) at Duke. Every step forward in brain tumor research is made possible by the generosity of donors like the Knox Martin Foundation. **Your support not only funds specific studies, but also builds the infrastructure, team strength, and research capacity that make progress across our entire program possible.**

Here's what your partnership has helped us achieve this year:

1. PESKE Trial – Now completed and closed, results have been published. Based on what we learned, we are now launching a follow-up project that uses focused ultrasound to safely open the blood-brain barrier and improve how drugs reach tumors inside the brain.

2. FLIRT Trial with Fluoxetine – Also completed, this trial has produced encouraging early findings. We are preparing a scientific abstract for presentation at the American Association for Cancer Research meeting in spring 2026, with a full manuscript to follow.

3. TIL Development – Preclinical efforts are advancing to prepare the next wave of IND-enabling studies. We expect a publication next year describing biological determinants of successful TIL expansion.

4. Personalized Vaccine Program – Functional validation is underway as our lab moves toward IND submission and first-in-human testing.

5. MOAB Trial – This multicenter immunotherapy trial is now open at Duke, Kansas City, Huntsman Cancer Center (Utah), and UCSF, **with 35 patients enrolled**. Foundation support has enabled the purchase of specialized reagents and kits for deep analysis of patient samples. These studies will help us understand how therapy reshapes the tumor immune environment and how those changes relate to clinical benefit.

These initiatives span the full continuum of brain cancer research: from completed trials moving toward publication, to cutting-edge preclinical innovation, to an ongoing trial already making a difference for patients. **Your support is the bridge that sustains these efforts** with our team here at the Duke Brain Tumor Center and accelerates discoveries that would otherwise not be possible.

In addition to the studies detailed, the TIL Lab is advancing other important glioblastoma trials: **PuMP** (NCT06126744), **ETAPA** (NCT05283109), and **GIANT** (NCT06816927). While the Knox Martin Foundation is not directly funding these specific trials, **the infrastructure, staffing, and research environment enabled by your support have been instrumental in making them possible.**

KMF sent a year-end gift of \$150,000 to the Duke Brain Tumor Center, finishing out 2025 with a grand total of \$400,000 in funds granted to Duke for innovative brain cancer research!!

This year-end gift will sustain patient enrollment, serial biospecimen analysis, and longitudinal immune profiling for the MOAB Trial. Over the next two years, the MOAB trial will continue to mature and generate data critical for future clinical development and impact.
